## POWER OF ATTORNEY REQUIREMENTS

A Power of Attorney, or other written authorization executed by the taxpayer, is required by the Clerk of Circuit Court, Lee County, Florida, in order for the taxpayer's representative to perform on behalf of the taxpayer one or more of the following acts:

- 1. To inspect confidential information (example: tax returns, audit reports).
- 2. To receive notices, assessments, determinations, redeterminations, tax forms, billings, refunds, communications and correspondence containing confidential information.
- 3. To represent the taxpayer at conferences.
- 4. To execute a waiver to extend the statutory period for assessment or collection of tax.
- 5. To execute any other waivers or agreements on behalf of the taxpayer.

This Power of Attorney requirement applies to Lee County Tourist Development tax matters of individuals, partnerships and corporations.

## **Exceptions to Power of Attorney Requirements:**

- 1. A Power of Attorney is not required for the taxpayer's representative to inspect confidential information or to represent the taxpayer at conferences, if he is accompanied by the taxpayer or, if a corporation, by an officer or authorized employee of the corporation.
- 2. Generally, a Power of Attorney is not required in the case of a trustee, receiver, guardian administrator or executor of an estate, or a representative appointed by a court.

## Filing Power of Attorney:

- 1. One copy of a Power of Attorney is required to be filed with the Clerk of Circuit Court, Lee County, Florida.
- 2. One copy of a Power of Attorney must be filed in each office of Lee County in which the representative, in connection with the matter under consideration, desires to perform one or more of the acts enumerated in Section 1 above.
