What to Do to Protect You and Your Family

If you receive an e-mail with the subject of "55th Anniversary and Free Pizza", delete it without

opening it. Of course, a hacker may use a different title, but this is the one we currently know.

- Unless it's on the official site of the company who produces the product (e.g. free pizza coupon on Pizza Hut's official site), don't click on offers for freebies. Many of them are scams that often include malware. Even then, it's possible to end up downloading malware from an official site if the site was compromised.
- If infected, download the latest malware updates for your anti-virus, unplug your computer from the Internet, and run a full scan.
- Since this particular malware steals passwords, change all your passwords-yep, all of them.
