Operation Green Light targets overdue Lee County traffic tickets, court fees

Those with overdue traffic tickets or court fees in Lee County that affect the status of your driver's license can take advantage of a statewide initiative offering a break on collection of those fees during Operation Green Light starting Monday.

During last year's event, nearly 850 Lee County customers saved more than \$1 million and 545 were able to reinstate their license.

The in-house and virtual event is from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. Feb. 22 to March 4; 8 a.m. to 7 p.m. March 5 (virtual after 5pm) and 9 a.m. to 2 p.m. (virtual only) March 6.

Customers can connect via TeleClerk video conference or call 239-533-5000 to pay by credit card. To connect to TeleClerk, click on the icon on the homepage of LeeClerk.org.

Customers paying in cash or by check at the Justice Center or the Cape Coral office must schedule an appointment at LeeClerk.org. Only TeleClerk services are available during extended office hours.

Customers unable to pay in full can participate via a payment plan.

Once all court fees and traffic tickets are paid in full, customers may be eligible to reinstate their driver licenses. Additional fees may be required by the Lee County Tax Collector's office to reinstate a driver license.
