

has been around for years with several variations. Basically, the caller pretends to be a law enforcement officer, state attorney or a court official saying that you failed to show for Jury Duty. The scammer tells you a fine was imposed and if you don't pay it, a warrant will be issued for your arrest. To resolve the problem, they may ask for your bank account number, or suggest purchasing a prepaid debit card number and providing the numbers on the back of the card, or ask for personal information such as your social security number. **Don't do it!!!!**

- ❖ The Clerk's office does not call or e-mail residents to request payment for missing Jury Duty. The office will also never request payment via any sort of prepaid debit card.
- ❖ The Clerk's office does not call or e-mail residents to verify information related to Jury Duty or to notify them that they missed jury duty. Communications are only sent by mail or by a **returned** telephone call or email.
- ❖ If a resident misses jury duty, the individual receives a failure to appear notice in the mail from the judge representing their Circuit Court.
- ❖ Arrest warrants are not usually issued for failure to report for Jury Duty.
